Commission on Opticianry Accreditation Summer 2011 Update

COA News:

The Commission on Opticianry Accreditation currently accredits 20 degree and 2 laboratory certificate programs. The Commissioners had a successful meeting in April, held in Denver. One important outcome of that meeting was the decision to offer any school not currently accredited a financial incentive by applying the \$500 application fee to the first year accreditation fee. There are two schools who have sent in applications for initial accreditation. The Commissioners also elected Amy Lewis to serve another year as Chair, with James Reece as Vice Chair, and Renato Cappuccitti as Treasurer. The Commissioners reviewed parts of the Essentials, and propose the following changes: 1) adding a Social Science to the Behavioral Science requirement; recommending an instructor/student ratio of 1:40 in lecture settings and 1:14 in lab/clinical settings. Two retiring Commissioners (Jayne Weinberger and Danne Ventura) will be greatly missed, and are being replaced by Jeffrey Rohlf (OAA) and Jonathan Parrelli (NAO).

For those programs on the Fall Annual Report list - your Annual Report is due by September 15. Accreditation fees for all are due Nov. 1.

Director Debra White attended the June NFOS meeting. She gave the NFOS members updates on COA happenings, and presented an Evaluator's Workshop.

Many new evaluators came from that, adding a greatly-needed number to the educator evaluator list for on-site visits. Anyone not present at that meeting can take the Evaluator's Workshop found on coaccreditation.com. The Essentials require that one member on an on-site team be an educator. There are four on-site visits slated for fall 2011.

TRANSITIONS OPTICAL ANNOUNCES ITS 2011 STUDENTS OF VISION SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS AND THEME FOR 2012 PROGRAM

Fifteen Winning Projects Demonstrate “Multicultural Vision”

PINELLAS PARK, Fla., May 24, 2011 – Optometry and opticianry students from across North America submitted projects for the 2011 Students of Vision Scholarship from Transitions Optical, Inc. Supported by the Transitions Healthy Sight for Life Fund™, 15 entries demonstrating this year’s “Multicultural” theme were selected as scholarship winners.

To encourage creativity, projects were accepted in three categories: Activity/Event, Multi-media and Other. Students were encouraged to be creative as they explored their role in patient care relative to ethnically diverse patients. Projects included research papers, presentations, videos, posters and community outreach. Projects were judged by a group of Transitions Optical representatives, eyecare professionals and marketing specialists.
